New on the calendar is the <u>Sumatanga Road</u> <u>Race Series</u>, beginning

January 26th. This three-race series in Gallant, AL is a non-points race, ranging from 30-60 miles depending on race category and is great way to get those race legs ready early in the season!

On the State Championship front, the 2019 road race state championship will be heading to Sparta, TN for the first time. <u>The Aaron Shafer Memorial Road</u> <u>Race</u>, traditionally a spring race, will host the State Championship on July 27, 2019.
