The Max Gander Memorial Criterium in Sevier Park coincides with Sevier Park Fest— a free event including concerts, food, and of course, bike racing. The following day, make your way to Cedar Hill Park for The Cedar Hill Criterium. The Promoter, Hattie B's Racing always promises a great time, including food trucks, great payouts, a competitive field, and live commentating.

On the state championship front, The <u>Rockabilly Grand Prix</u> is once again hosting the state championship criterium on June 9th in Jackson, TN. It boasts a fast, fun course with a small, uphill sprint finish! The state TT is once again in Dover, TN. This year's state road race takes off in Sparta, TN at the <u>Aaron Shafer Memorial Road Race</u>. The course includes plenty of rollers and opportunities to make that break!
